

Project Profile: New Town Hall - Town of Elma, NY - 2005

Project Budget: \$ 3 million

Project Summary:

The Town of Elma had outgrown its existing School House sized Town Hall, and was seeking a new building to better accommodate their needs.

The design of the new Town Hall was intended blend of traditional small town scale architectural elements to create a formal feel that was residential in character.

The resulting design combined arts and crafts styling, workmanship and detailing to create an aesthetic unique to the Town of Elma's identity and history.

Primary Project Objectives:

- ⇒ 12,000 square foot first floor plan.
- ⇒ Building houses all essential Town administration personnel in north wing.
- ⇒ Judicial functions including Court Room, Judges chambers, and Court Clerk are housed in south wing along with an Erie County Sheriff's sub-station.
- ⇒ 9,000 square foot basement houses State Police sub-station, and is designed for future expansion.
